EX-COP SENTENCED FOR HIS PART IN “TIX-FIX” SCANDAL

Former PBA Delegate Brian McGuckin Pleads Guilty

(Bronx, NY – June 9, 2015) – Bronx District Attorney Robert Johnson announces the plea of guilty and sentencing of one of the former NYPD officers involved in the widespread ticket-fixing scandal that was exposed during the probe into now-convicted former fellow officer JOSE RAMOS.

The 47-year-old BRIAN MCGUCKIN, formerly of the 40th Precinct in the Bronx, pled guilty to a single count of Grand Larceny in the 4th Degree, P.L. 155.30(2), a Class-E felony. Supreme Court Justice Steven Barrett denied the Bronx D.A.’s request to sentence MCGUCKIN to 1,500 hours of community service, instead granting the former PBA delegate and financial secretary a conditional discharge, which will see him serve no jail time as long as he breaks no laws during the next three years. The defendant also waived his right to appeal the case.

MCGUCKIN was charged by a Bronx Grand Jury (Indictment # 3312/2011) with 181 counts, which included 25 counts of Grand Larceny in the 4th, 2 counts of Forgery in the 2nd Degree, 2 counts of Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument, 62 counts of Official Misconduct, 28 counts of Conspiracy in the 5th Degree, 28 counts of Criminal Solicitation in the 4th Degree, and 3 counts of Criminal Solicitation in the 5th Degree.

In total, the 2011 Grand Jury looking into the sweeping investigation into police corruption returned 22 indictments, charging 21 defendants with 1,600 felony and misdemeanor accounts, all touched off by the anonymous tip received by the NYPD Internal Affairs Bureau into the illegal business activities of now-convicted 40th Precinct Office JOSE RAMOS. As part of that investigation, IAB discovered the organized and wide-scale practice of fixing

parking and moving violation tickets, criminal and other summonses, mostly done by PBA delegates and officials for friends and family.

In BRIAN McGUCKIN's case, the Grand Jury charged 21 separate incidents of ticket fixing, primarily by orchestrating inaccurate, false, or incomplete information, including the removal and discarding of parking and moving summonses, allowing the motorists to avoid punishment.

McGUCKIN resigned from the NYPD yesterday and will lose part of the pension for his nearly 20 years on the job. In addition, he forfeits \$12,000 a year in a variable supplement to his pension, which he would have been eligible for, during the entire time he received a pension.

Earlier this year, disgraced officer JOSE RAMOS pled guilty to the remaining half-dozen indictments against him for crimes ranging from ticket-fixing to Grand Larceny, selling counterfeit CDs and DVDs, and conspiring to kill a witness against him on his earlier case. In 2014, a jury found RAMOS guilty on charges of Attempted Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 1st Degree and other crimes. With both cases, JOSE RAMOS has been sentenced to 15-1/2 to 23-1/2 years in prison.

Bronx District Attorney Robert Johnson wishes to thank Chief Joseph Resnick and the Internal Affairs Bureau of the NYPD, in particular, case detective Randy Katakovsky, for their diligent work in this investigation.

Next to be tried is former PBA delegate from the 41st Precinct CHRISTOPHER MANZI, facing similar charges in a 158-count indictment. Jury selection in his case begins on June 17th before Justice Barrett, Part 60, Bronx Supreme Court.

The prosecutors on both the McGUCKIN and MANZI cases are Senior Trial Assistant D.A. Donald Levin and Assistant D.A. Kyung "Ann" Lee of the Bronx D.A.'s Investigations Division of the Rackets Bureau. The Chief of that Bureau is Stuart Levy.
