We are here to serve all New Yorkers. You have the right to respectful treatment at our Office, whether over the phone, in person, and any other way you interact with us. This means courteous interactions without:

- Discrimination of any kind
- Sexual harassment
- Retaliation or threats for reporting discrimination or harassment

The District Attorney is committed to ensuring that no one will be discriminated against for reasons of age, race, color, religion/creed, national origin, gender (identity, expression, or transgender status), disability, pregnancy (including related medical conditions), sexual orientation, marital or partnership status, military status, citizenship status, arrest or conviction record, status as a victim of domestic violence, sexual violence, or stalking, genetic predisposition or carrier status, height and/or weight, unemployment status, caregiver status, or credit history.

If you would like to report instances of discrimination, harassment, including sexual harassment, or retaliation or threats for reporting an incident, that you experienced while interacting with the Bronx District Attorney's Office, you can file a complaint with the Office by emailing EEO Officer Kim Hernandez at HernandezKi@BronxDA.nyc.gov.
